A. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 11:02am. Director Sabo, Director Sawhney, Executive Director La Pier, Deputy Director Morello and Deputy Executive Director Bergholz were in attendance.

D. REGULAR AGENDA - ACTION ITEMS

Discussion 1. Current Service Levels and Passenger Numbers

Director Sabo asked for a status of current air service levels currently being operated at the airport by our airline partners in response to the current COVID-19 crisis. Deputy Director Morello and Deputy Executive Director Bergholz reviewed current flight schedules with the committee and the requirement as part of the CARES Act for the airlines. Airlines are required to operate a minimum of 14 flights per week in the Monterey market under the CARES Act. Currently the schedule promoted by the airlines totals 21 flights per week.

Director Sabo asked about the flight cancellations and their impact on the required flight schedule. La Pier responded that no one would expect an airline to fly a flight that has no passengers and, from what has been observed, the cancellations are related to the fact that there are no passengers. Director Sawhney agreed that the cost of flying an empty airplane was something the airlines would like to avoid and it would make no sense for DOT or the Federal government to require the airlines to do so just to meet the CARES Act requirement.

Director Sabo asked what assurance we have that the airlines would continue to offer the required number of flights. La Pier responded that if the airlines failed to provide the required level of service and

there were passengers being disadvantaged as a result, DOT would have the ability to take action against the carriers and eliminate their eligibility for assistance under the Act.
