NOTICE REGARDING A RETURN TO IN-PERSON PUBLIC PARTICIPATION AT MONTEREY PENINSULA AIRPORT DISTRICT BOARD MEETINGS

A. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL

Chair Miller called to order the Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors at 9:05 AM. Directors Sawhney, Cursio, Leffel, and Sabo were present. Chair Miller attended via Zoom videoconference. The following staff were present: Executive Director La Pier, District Counsel Huber, Acting District Secretary Adams, Executive Deputy Director Bergholz, and Deputy Director Morello. Executive Deputy Director Bergholz and Deputy Director Morello attended via Zoom videoconference.

B. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Director Cursio led the Pledge of Allegiance.

C. COMMUNICATIONS/ANNOUNCEMENTS/INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

D. PUBLIC COMMENTS ON NON-AGENDA ITEMS

Any person may address the Monterey Peninsula Airport District Board at this time on any item that is <u>NOT</u> on today's agenda and should be within the jurisdiction of the Monterey Peninsula Airport District Board. Comments concerning matters set forth on this agenda will be heard at the time the matter is considered.

Howard Fosler, a member of the public and citizen of Monterey, CA stated noise is improving but there are still two flights that go straight out over the ocean. He noted when pilots follow the preferred path the noise is greatly reduced.

Director Leffel made a motion to approve Consent Agenda Items E.1 - E.5. Director Cursio seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by a roll call vote of 5-0.

F. DEFERRED CONSENT AGENDA - ACTION ITEMS

G. OPEN SESSION/PUBLIC HEARING

1. Redrawing of Board Member Election District Boundaries – Receive public input on and provide input regarding the composition of potential Board Member election district boundaries

District Counsel Huber stated this is the final Public Hearing on the matter of redrawing board member district boundaries to comply with the Fair Maps Act. District Counsel Huber stated all draft maps comply with state law. He turned the floor over to Doug Johnson with National Demographics Corporation. Mr. Johnson reviewed the existing district boundaries map and then explained adjustments made to the "Tan" draft map, which became a new draft map titled "Tan B".

Chair Miller called for public comment. Howard Fosler, representing the League of Women Voters, read a statement about the importance of voting rights and choosing boundaries that give the best chance of fair and equal representation. He stated he was impressed with the work that has been done.

There were no other public comments.

Chair Miller closed the Public Hearing at 9:20 AM.

H. REGULAR AGENDA - ACTION ITEMS

Adopt

1. Ordinance No. 929, an Urgency Ordinance of The Board of Directors of the Monterey Peninsula Airport District Establishing a By-District Election Process Pursuant to Elections Code Section 10010 and Repealing Ordinance No. 924

Executive Director La Pier introduced Item H.1. Chair Miller asked for board comment. Director Sabo asked Mr. Johnson to explain why map "Tan B" took population from District 5 and gave it to District 2. Mr. Johnson stated it had to do with compactness and keeping a precinct together. District Counsel Huber added Salinas Union High School District is a community of interest.

Directors discussed the new draft "Tan B".

Chair Miller asked if there was any public comment and there was none.

District Counsel Huber explained Ordinance No. 929 is an urgency ordinance due to the time constraints of the elections code; the board must adopt an election district boundaries map by April 17th. The next regular board meeting is April 20th, and an ordinance must be passed at a regular meeting. He stated an urgency ordinance requires a 4/5th vote to pass and takes effect immediately.

District Counsel Huber explained Ordinance No. 929 has two items that must be determined prior to adopting it. The first is to determine the map that will represent the district boundaries; the second is the sequencing of elections going forward. The determinations will be written in and become part of Ordinance No. 929 prior to it being adopted.

Director Leffel made a motion to adopt the District Boundary map labeled "Tan B". Director Cursio seconded the motion. Director Sabo objected. The board discussed his objections until Director Cursio called the question. Director Leffel seconded the call. The motion passed 4-1 with Director Sabo voting no.

Chair Miller called for Public Comment and there was none.

Director Leffel moved to adopt a sequencing of elections so that Directors from Board Districts 4 and 5 shall be elected beginning at the General Municipal Election in November 2022, and every four years thereafter, and the Board Members from Board Districts 1, 2 and 3 shall be elected beginning at the General Municipal Election in November 2024, and every four years thereafter. Director Cursio seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by roll call vote of 5-0.

Director Leffel moved to approve Ordinance No. 929, an Urgency Ordinance of The Board of Directors of the Monterey Peninsula Airport District Establishing a By-District Election Process Pursuant to Elections Code Section 10010 and Repealing Ordinance No. 924 with district boundary map "Tan B" and the appropriate sequencing incorporated in the ordinance presented. Director Sawhney seconded the motion. The motion passed by a 4/5th majority by a roll call vote of 4-1 with Director Sabo voting no.

ORDINANCE NO. 929

AN URGENCY ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE MONTEREY PENINSULA AIRPORT DISTRICT ESTABLISHING A BY-DISTRICT ELECTION PROCESS PURSUANT TO ELECTIONS CODE SECTION 10010 AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 924

WHEREAS, the Monterey Peninsula Airport District is a California Special District, duly organized pursuant to special legislation passed by the State of California; and

- **WHEREAS**, the board members of the Monterey Peninsula Airport District are currently elected in at-large elections, in which each Board Member is elected by all registered voters of the entire District; and
- WHEREAS, at-large election systems such as those presently employed by the District to elect Board Members, are subject to challenge under the California Voting Rights Act of 2001, codified at sections 14025, et seq., of the California Elections Code ("CVRA"); and
- **WHEREAS,** "by-trustee area" electoral systems, whereby only voters residing within a specific trustee district vote only for the trustee representing that trustee district, are not similarly vulnerable to challenge under the CVRA; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Board of Directors previously determined that it is in the best interest of the District to move from its current at-large electoral system to a by-district election for members of the Board of Directors in furtherance of the purposes of CVRA; and
- WHEREAS, the Monterey Peninsula Airport District previously transitioned to election by electoral districts; and
- **WHEREAS**, as a result of the Census issuance by the United States of America, the Monterey Peninsula Airport District is required to adjust the boundaries of the by-district maps to comply with state and federal law; and
- **WHEREAS**, consistent with Elections Code 10010, the Monterey Peninsula Airport District has held public hearings and published several tentative by-district maps for consideration by the Board of Directors and members of the public; and
- **WHEREAS**, it is the considered view of the Board of Directors that revised draft map "Tan B", attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated into this Ordinance by reference, will serve the best interests of the Monterey Peninsula Airport District; and
- **WHEREAS**, this Urgency Ordinance is necessary as a result of the timelines mandated by AB 1276 for redistricting purposes, that this Ordinance is declared by the Board of Directors to be necessary for preserving the integrity of the election process and the recitals above taken together constitute the Board of Director's statement of the reasons for adopting this Ordinance on an urgency basis.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE MONTEREY PENINSULA AIRPORT DISTRICT AS FOLLOWS:

- **SECTION 1.** The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference.
 - **SECTION 2.** Ordinance 924 is hereby repealed.
- <u>SECTION 3.</u> (A) Beginning with the general municipal election in November 2022, Board Members shall be elected in the electoral districts reflected on the map contained in Exhibit A hereto, which is incorporated herein by this reference, and as subsequently reapportioned as provided by law. Elections shall take place on a by-district basis as that term is defined in California Government Code section 34871, meaning one member of the Board of Directors shall be elected from each district, by the voters of that district alone. Each Board Member shall serve a four-year term until his or her successor has qualified.
- (B) The Board Member elected to represent a district must reside in that district and be a registered voter in that district, and any candidate for the Board of Directors must live, and be a

registered voter in, the district in which he or she seeks election at the time nomination papers are issued, pursuant to California Government Code section 34882 and Elections Code section 10227. Termination of residency in a district by a Board Member shall create an immediate vacancy for that Board district unless a substitute residence within the district is established within 30 days after the termination of residency.

- (C) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, each of the Board Members in office at the time this Ordinance takes effect shall continue in office until the expiration of the full term to which he or she was elected and until his or her successor is qualified. Vacancies in Board Member offices elected at-large may be filled from the District at-large. At the end of the term of each Board Member, that member's successor shall be elected on a by-district basis in the districts established in Subsection A and the map contained in Exhibit A hereto, as subsequently reapportioned as provided by law. A vacancy in a Board Member office elected by-district shall be filled by a person qualified to hold the office, who is a resident of the district.
- **SECTION 3**. The Board Members from Board Districts 4 and 5 shall be elected beginning at the General Municipal Election in November 2022, and every four years thereafter. The Board Members from Board Districts 1, 2 and 3 shall be elected beginning at the General Municipal Election in November 2024, and every four years thereafter.
- **SECTION 4.** The Board of Directors finds that this proposed ordinance is exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations, Section 15061 (b)(3) in that it is not a project which has the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment.
- SECTION 5. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such a decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. Such section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase, instead, shall be superseded and replaced by the corresponding provisions, if any exist, of Title 24 of the California Code of Regulations. The Board of Directors of the Monterey Peninsula Airport District hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance and each section or subsection, sentence, clause and phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared invalid.
- **SECTION 6.** To the extent the terms and provisions of this Ordinance may be inconsistent or in conflict with the terms or conditions of any prior ordinance, motion, resolution, rule or regulation governing the same subject, the terms of this Ordinance shall prevail with respect to the subject matter thereof.
- **SECTION 7.** In interpreting this Ordinance or resolving any ambiguity, this Ordinance shall be interpreted in a manner that effectively accomplishes its stated purposes.
- SECTION 8. This Ordinance shall be of no further force and effect if the California Voting Rights Act, Elections Code sections 14025 through 14032, as it now exists or may hereafter be amended, is repealed, or declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be facially unconstitutional, in whole or in part, or unconstitutional, in whole or in part, as applied to the Monterey Peninsula Airport District, or is amended such that its provisions no longer apply to the Monterey Peninsula Airport District. In the event this Ordinance is of no further force and effect pursuant to this section, the Board of Directors shall immediately consider an ordinance repealing this Ordinance. In the event this Ordinance is of no further force and effect pursuant to this section, the incumbent Board Members elected pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance shall complete their terms of office until their successors are qualified, and their successors shall be elected at-large in the order in which the terms of the then-incumbent Board Members expire and in accordance with all other provisions of law, until such time as the voters of the

Monterey Peninsula Airport District shall approve a different method of election of Board Members in accordance with Government Code section 34871, et seq.

SECTION 9. This Ordinance is an Urgency Ordinance enacted under California Government Code Sections 36934 and 36937(a). This Urgency Ordinance is immediately effective upon adoption by a four-fifths vote of the Board of Directors.

SECTION 10. The Executive Director is authorized to take any and all other necessary actions to give effect to this Ordinance.

Chair Miller asked Director Sawhney to chair the remainder of the meeting and excused himself. Director Sawhney, as Chair Pro Tem, called for a break at 10:31 AM.

Chair Pro Tem Sawhney resumed the meeting at 10:39 AM.

Discussion 2. Local Agency Formation Commission of Monterey County (LAFCO) Ballot

Executive Director La Pier introduced Item H.2 stating Monterey Peninsula Airport District is being asked to cast a ballot with LAFCO for one of the candidates to represent special districts. La Pier read the candidate names and affiliations. Chair Pro Tem Sawnhey asked if there was any public comment.

Howard Fosler, a member of the public and as an individual, commented he thought this is a good chance for Directors to express themselves.

Director Sabo asked to confirm the elected position on the LAFCO board represents all special districts. Executive Director La Pier answered yes. Director Cursio expressed his support for Director Leffel.

Director Cursio made a motion to select Mary Ann Leffel as the Monterey Peninsula Airport District's vote for the election of one regular special district representative to LAFCO. Chair Pro Tem Sawhney seconded the motion. The motion passed by a roll call vote of 3-1 with Director Sabo abstaining.

Adopt

3. Resolution No. 1817, a Resolution Authorizing a Professional Services Agreement with Mill Construction as the Design Build Team for the Replacement Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighting Facility

Executive Director La Pier introduced Item H.3 stating Resolution No. 1817 covers the design only. He stated the design is needed to determine a guaranteed maximum price for the FAA grant funding application.

Chair Pro Tem Sawhney asked if there was any public comment and there was none.

Director Leffel complimented staff and stated the Finance Committee supports Resolution No. 1817. Deputy Director Morello reviewed the proposal process saying evaluation was on both cost and technical knowledge. Three firms responded. Deputy Director Morello stated Mill Construction was not the highest or the lowest bidder, but they were considered reasonable as they were within 1% of the

independent fee estimate (IFE). Director Sawhney asked what would be done before the Airport Improvement Program (AIP) grant application date of April 11th. Deputy Director Morello answered Mill Construction will give us a guaranteed max price which we will be able to submit to the FAA with our grant application.

Director Leffel made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 1817, a Resolution Authorizing a Professional Services Agreement with Mill Construction as the Design Build Team for the Replacement Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighting Facility. Director Sabo seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by a roll call vote of 4-0.

RESOLUTION NO. 1817

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH MILL CONSTRUCTION AS THE DESIGN BUILD TEAM FOR THE REPLACEMENT AIRCRAFT RESCUE AND FIRE FIGHTING FACILITY

WHEREAS, On November 26, 2018, the Board of Directors of the Monterey Peninsula Airport District (MPAD) approved Resolution No. 1730 certifying Final Environmental Impact Report (EIR) (SCH 2015121105), and Resolution No. 1731, approving Alternative 1 as the Airport Master Plan Project for Monterey Regional Airport; and

WHEREAS, the certified Final EIR and the approved Airport Master Plan Project for Monterey Regional Airport analyzed and included permanent relocation of the Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighting Facility to the north side of the Airport from the south side; and

WHEREAS, the certified Final EIR for the approved Airport Master Plan Project for Monterey Regional Airport was never challenged; and

WHEREAS, the FY22 Adopted Capital Improvement Budget contains Project 2022-01 Safety Enhancement Project Phase B, Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighting Facility (ARFF) Design/Construction/Demo/Airfield Access; and

WHEREAS, the Monterey Peninsula Airport District (MPAD) has previously submitted an Airport Capital Improvement Program (ACIP) for FY 2021-2025 that includes this Project; and

WHEREAS, representatives of the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) have given the approval for use of Alternate Project Delivery Method (APDM) Design-Build (D/B) for the AIP-funded project ARFF Building Design/Construction/Demo/Airfield Access; and

WHEREAS Design and Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) must be received by the FAA by April 11, 2022 to complete a grant application; and

WHEREAS, approval of any design contract for the ARFF Building Design/Construction/Demo/Airfield Access will not result in any development activity or ground disturbance at the Airport. Currently, MPAD will only issue a Notice to Proceed for Design and a new contract will come back to the MPAD Board for a contract for the Build process.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE MONTEREY PENINSULA AIRPORT DISTRICT: That MPAD contract with the Design Build Team led by Mill Construction for Design and preliminary engineering of the ARFF Design/Construction/Demo/Airfield Access including development of design, specifications and working details to obtain a GMP in an amount not-to-exceed \$1,169,892.00.

Further, the Recitals above are incorporated in full into this approval.
