

ORDINANCE NO. 448

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MONTEREY PENINSULA AIRPORT DISTRICT ADOPTING THE 1990 EDITION OF THE NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE, REGULATING AND CONTROLLING THE INSTALLATION OF ELECTRIC CONDUCTORS AND EQUIPMENT WITHIN OR ON PUBLIC AND PRIVATE BUILDINGS OR OTHER STRUCTURES, PREMISES AND INDUSTRIAL SUBSTATIONS, INSTALLATION OF CONDUCTORS THAT CONNECT TO THE SUPPLY OF ELECTRICITY, INSTALLATION OF OTHER OUTSIDE CONDUCTORS ON THE PREMISES, AND INSTALLATION OF OPTICAL FIBER CABLE IN THE MONTEREY PENINSULA AIRPORT; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF; AND REPEALING ALL OTHER ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE MONTEREY PENINSULA AIRPORT DISTRICT DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That certain document, three (3) copies of which are on file in the office of the Monterey Peninsula Airport District, being marked and designated as "National Electrical Code," published by the National Fire Protection Association be and is hereby adopted as the code of the Monterey Peninsula Airport District for regulating the installation of electrical conductors and equipment within or on public and private buildings or other structures, premises, and substations, installation of conductors that connect to the supply of electricity, installation of other outside conductors on the premises, and installation of optical fiber cable; and each and all of the regulations, provisions, conditions and terms of such "National Electrical Code," 1990 edition, published by the National Fire Protection Association on file in the office of the Monterey Peninsula Airport District are hereby referred to, adopted and made a part hereof as if fully set out in this ordinance.

SECTION 2. Any person, firm or corporation violating any provisions of the code or standards hereby adopted shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed \$1,000 or by imprisonment in the county jail for not to exceed six months, or both fine and imprisonment. Each separate day or any portion thereof, during which any violation of the code or standards occurs or continues, shall be deemed to constitute a separate offense and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punishable as herein provided. The imposition of any one penalty for any violation shall not excuse the violation or permit it to continue and all such violations shall be

corrected or remedied by the person, firm or corporation responsible for the violation within a reasonable time. The application of any penalties provided for above shall not be held to prevent the enforced removal of any violation of the code hereby adopted.

SECTION 3. Any and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict or inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. That if any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The Board of Directors of the Monterey Peninsula Airport District hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance, and each section, subsection, clause or phrase hereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses and phrases be declared unconstitutional.

SECTION 5. That this ordinance and the rules, regulations, provisions, requirements, orders and matters established and adopted hereby shall take effect and be in full force and effect thirty (30) days from and after the date of its final passage and adoption.
